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#### THE IMPACTS OF INSECURITY ON AMERICAN CHILDREN

## Food Insecurity in The United States

- 10.5% (13.8 million) American households were food insecure at some time in 2020.
- Household food insecurity impacted <u>14.8%</u> of American households with children in 2020.
- According to an estimate by researchers at Northwestern University, food insecurity <u>more than doubled</u> in the United States between 2019-2020.

# Impacts of Childhood Food Insecurity on Health

- Children who grow up in food insecure homes often experience cognitive, emotional, and physical <u>delays</u>.
- Food-insecure children are almost <u>twice as likely</u> to be in fair or poor health when compared to food-secure children and are significantly more likely to be hospitalized.
- Food-insecure families are <u>significantly more likely</u> than food-secure families to report eating unhealthy foods.

## Impacts of Childhood Food Insecurity on Education

- Children from food-insecure families show <u>smaller gains in both reading in math</u> when compared to their food-secure peers.
- By the time they are teenagers, children from food-insecure families are <u>twice as likely</u> as their food-secure peers to have been suspended from school.
- Food-insecure children and teenagers are <u>more likely</u> than food-secure peers to need to repeat a grade in school and are less likely to graduate high school.
